

### Most MD Voters Believe Cost of Living Has Been Rising Faster Than Wages

# Very Strong Support for Proposed Increase In State Minimum Wage to \$10/hr

There is a proposal that may come up in the state legislature this year to raise the minimum wage in Maryland. The current minimum wage for workers in Maryland is \$7.25 an hour, or about \$15,000 a year for someone working a 40-hour work week. There is a proposal to raise the minimum wage to \$8.25 this year, and then increase it to \$10.00 by the year 2013. 


# **Most Voters Also Support Boost in Minimum Wage for Tipped Workers**

All things considered, do you think that increasing the minimum wage would help the statewide economy, hurt the statewide economy, or not have much impact on the economy either way?





## Impact of Minimum Wage Vote On Legislative Elections
